

A RESOLUTION

ADOPTING THE PUBLIC HOUSING AGENCY PLAN AND ADMINISTRATIVE PLAN FOR USE BY THE AUTHORITY IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE SECTION 8 HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHER PROGRAM AND OTHER MATTERS RELATED HERETO.

WHEREAS, the Authority administers the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program (the "Voucher Program") under an Annual Contributions Contract (ACC) with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in seven counties (Clarendon, Colleton, Dorchester, Fairfield, Kershaw, Lee and Lexington) of the State of South Carolina; and

WHEREAS, HUD regulations require the Authority to develop a Public Housing Agency Plan ("PHA Plan") that describes the Authority's mission and long-range goals and objectives for achieving its mission over a five-year period as it relates to the Voucher Program, and its approach to managing and providing services within the program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, HUD regulations also require the Authority to adopt a written Administrative Plan that establishes local policies for administration of the Voucher Program and to revise the plan, if needed, to comply with HUD requirements; and

WHEREAS, the staff of the Authority has, in the manner required by HUD, prepared its Annual PHA Plan and Administrative Plan for the Voucher Program and has made said Plans available for comment by members of the public in a manner consistent with HUD Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the PHA Plan and Administrative Plan prepared by the staff of the Authority is attached to this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, HUD regulations require that the Authority's PHA Plan and Administrative Plan for the Voucher Program be adopted by the Authority's Board of Commissioners;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE SOUTH CAROLINA STATE HOUSING FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY IN MEETING DULY ASSEMBLED: that the attached Public Housing Agency Annual Plan for Fiscal Year 2025 and Administrative Plan are adopted for use by the Authority in the administration of the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program.

- (6) Qualified PHA A PHA with 550 or fewer public housing dwelling units and/or housing choice vouchers combined and is not PHAS or SEMAP troubled.

	The South Carolina State Housing Finance and Development Authority has made the following progress in meeting and exceeding the goals and objectives described in the previous Five-Year Plan as follows:
	1. Continued the identification and selection of affordable housing opportunities and options through enhanced community outreach. We host an online Housing Opportunities webpage to provide access to several search databases of affordable housing (https://voucheronline.schousing.com/housingopportunities.aspx). SC Housing is updating an Authority sponsored free affordable housing search website database (SCHousingSearch.com) that allows anyone to search for and locate affordable housing that meets their needs. Phase 2, expected by end of 1 st quarter 2024, will allow landlords interested in participating in the Housing Choice Voucher Program to list their properties.
	2. We continue to maintain a 95% or better family record (HUD-50058) submission rate monthly.
	3. Initiated partnership with local Office of Veteran Affairs to expedite and streamline the implementation and administration of VASH vouchers.
	4. Maintained strong partnerships with Continuum of Care agencies to expedite and streamline the implementation and administration of Stability vouchers.
	5. Continued to educate participants and landlords concerning the VAWA protections, rights and obligations. An emergency transfer plan was also adopted which incorporates the contact information for the local organizations aiding victims of domestic violence throughout the State of South Carolina. These changes were incorporated into the HCVP Administrative Plan and added to SC Housing's website along with the brochures that were developed by the South Carolina Governor's Domestic Violence Task Force.
	6. Continued implementation of software that provides online access to applicants, participants and landlords. Applicants can apply for assistance, monitor position on waiting list and update household information. Participants are able to communicate with caseworkers, upload documents and complete re-examinations on-line. Owners can monitor inspections, view payment information and communicate with caseworkers.
	7. Implemented the use of an electronic signature software to allow completion and execution of required program forms. Implementation of this software helps expedite voucher issuance, leasing and the annual re-examination process.
	8. Collaborated with SC Housing's mortgage production department to create webpage for the HCV Homeownership Program. This site provides information for statewide use and includes information for a down payment assistance program.
	9. SC Housing employees continue to face challenges in the post-pandemic workforce and housing market. We continue to focus on becoming trained and knowledgeable in technology to provide quality and timely service to the Housing Choice Voucher participants and the citizens of the State of South Carolina. SC Housing is implementing a "go digital" initiative to help meet these needs.
	10. SC Housing has doubled the HCV department workforce to allow a more equitable distribution of workload to improve customer service and expedite file processing of the 50058.
	11. SC Housing has reinstated STEPS, a career development program to promote leadership and management skills. Two HCV department members were nominated and have successfully completed the program.
	12. Continued to identify and promote program utilization of targeted funding vouchers to allow housing assistance for families that may be facing greater risks in the post-pandemic housing market.
	13. Successfully managed the Emergency Housing Vouchers (EHV) team to fast track utilization of these vouchers in our communities. We continue to grow strong partnerships with local Continuums of Care, community action agencies and landlords to support families utilizing the EHV program.
	14. We had a successful HUD on-site review of the EHV program resulting in no findings.

	Finding No. 2022-001: Special Tests and Provisions – Housing Quality Standards (HQS) Inspections. Condition: The Authority did not perform HQS and QC inspections in accordance with program compliance requirements. Context: A sample of 40 units found that 2 units were not inspected timely.
	Finding No. 2022-002: Special Tests and Provisions – HQS Enforcement Condition: The Authority did not require HQS deficiencies to be corrected within the required timeframe. The Authority did not abate payment of subsidy for units that failed to correct HQS deficiencies within the required timeframe. Context: Exceptions were noted in 16 out of 40 inspections.
	Finding No. 2022-003: Special Tests and Provisions – Depository Agreement Condition: The Authority does not have a depository agreement in place with HUD. Housing Voucher Cluster funds are not deposited in a separate interest-bearing account. Context: A depository agreement has not been executed.
	Repeat Finding No. 2022-004: Special Tests and Provisions – Reasonable Rent Condition: The Authority did not perform rent reasonableness procedures in accordance with program compliance requirements.
